Wayts to Defamiliarize

Inverted Imagery

- intended as prosaic and accepted as poetic, or intended as poetic and accepted as prosaic.
 Parallelism
- Creating a unique semantic modificaton (turn of phrase) to transfer the usual perception of an object into the sphere of new perception
